ing and accessories retailer have expressed interest in renting the new space.

Juliano's application states that the "buildings shall match the character of existing buildings on the lot and on surrounding lots."

"We want to continue the development of a neighborhood business district," Juliano said. "This adds more retail and the element that is missing – offices. It's a true mixed-use."

He said no more residential units are included in the new buildings.

Juliano said he is planning more than enough parking spaces for the customers drawn in by the new businesses. His application states that proposed parking exceeds the required parking amount for

both day and night time use by 12 and 49 spaces respectively, eliminating concerns of additional peak period congestion."

"It's good for the develop-

ment. It's good for the town," local developer Michael Juliano said.
"I'm probably the biggest supporter of getting that done. We'll move forward building as much of the sidewalk as we can feasibly do."

Juliano plans to install a new septic system even though he doesn't have to but, he said, he is counting on the current one failing at any time.

"We're overbuilding a whole new septic system," he

said. "We don't need to...but we are ready to abandon the current system. We're ready if it fails."

The Duxbury Board of Health has hired a consultant to review the plans for the new septic system.

Juilano is also constructing sidewalks along the development, saying he was a big "advocate" of installing them.

"It's good for the development. It's good for the town," he said. "I'm probably the biggest supporter of getting that done. We'll move forward building as much of the sidewalk as we can feasibly do."

Before calling for a vote on the application, ZBA hearing chairwoman Judy Barrett said: "It's wonderful to see redevelopment and reinvestment happening in this area."
